### IMPORTANT UPDATE

Along with our new dues structure, we are adopting some language changes in hopes of clarifying the use of the adjectives "juried" and "non-juried."

We hope to formalize this soon in the bylaws, but until that can be accomplished, we are at least temporarily using the following new terminology:

People who have joined Seattle Co-Arts will be called 'Members'.

Once successfully going through the "Screening Process" they will be "Exhibiting Members," [rather than "Juried Members" as in the past,] and will be eligible to exhibit in all Seattle Co-Arts sponsored shows.

Our **Juried Shows** will continue to be "curated" or "juried" by someone selected by the Show Chairperson and the Board.

**Non-juried shows** will not be "juried" or curated by anyone selected or hired by Seattle Co-Arts. (However some venues like Era Living shows are curated by the Era Living curator)

Only Exhibiting Members may enter any Seattle Co-Arts exhibits, juried / curated, or not.

All members may submit work for Painting of the Month and vote for Painting of the Month.



## FEBRUARY DEMONSTRATION

#### Vikram Madan, An Imaginative Genius

Happiness is one of the most valuable benefits of making art. This was my main take-away from Vikram Madan's recent Co-Arts presentation! He thoroughly entertained us, telling his art story and showing us the many uses of Procreate on his iPad. His calm, confident, and clever sense of his many talents captivated our sensibilities. Having grown up in Delhi, India, he remembers drawing for survival. Because he considered art a hobby rather than a career, he pursued a tech/engineering path. He tells his



story with such humility. Finding himself with a mortgage, kid expenses, needing to save for their college, and taking care of his parents, his decision to quit his job required quite a leap of faith. As he puts it, "I finally came to my senses and followed my heart into the visual and literary arts, creating work that can be humorous, quirky, fun, light-hearted, philosophical, thought-provoking, and sometimes, all of these at the same time".

If you're interested, Procreate can be purchased from The Apple Store for \$10. To learn the program, he uses the instruction booklet that comes with it. He makes it look simple



but we all know it took him long, focused hours and experimentation to have so many of the digital tools at his disposal. There seems to be no end to discovering new and creative ways to use the features. He demonstrated the oil, acrylic, ink, and watercolor options. He showed us converting to different colors from black and white, shading, erasing, and using all kinds of brushes and cool affects. The layering features are not possible with traditional art making.

Vikram certainly has a wide range of creative talents. He's a published poet, has illustrated his own children's books and has

been involved in "public art" to name a few. Vikram, we thank you for sharing with us your love of making art.

Vikram ended his presentation at the request of his audience by reciting his poem "The Internet is Down" which to me resonates with all ages, especially me who now relies on it to connect with family, friends and my Art Tribe. Made me smile. Joan, editor

#### Poulnabrone dolmen (Poll na

Brón in Irish[2]) is an unusually large dolmen or portal tomb located in the Burren, County Clare, Ireland. Situated on one of the most desolate and highest points of the region, it comprises three standing portal stones supporting a heavy horizontal capstone, and dates to the Neolithic period, probably between 4200 BC and 2900 BC.

Because it's March I have taken the liberty to show a painting I did in Ireland.

It is a place I have visited many times. In late Spring, if there are not too many tourists, one can sit quietly and listen to the song of the larks overhead.

The dolmen was built by Neolithic farmers, who chose the location either for ritual, as a territorial marker, or as a collective burial site.

It is an ancient burial site and when it was excavated in 1986 and 1988 about 33 human remains were found buried underneath it.
