

JANUARY DEMONSTRATION:

Liz Walker's work is a feast of color. She lives in Oregon now, but her work is influenced by

her time spent in Texas. With a bright and vibrant palette Liz's work is inspirational in its experimental and improvisational approach. She is adept at the Turkish art of marbling and treated the 51 members present to a demonstration using acrylic inks floated in a tray of water, treated with carrageenan, upon which she gently lays alum-treated paper.





Sometimes she marbles over old watercolor paintings and other times she collages her marbled

papers into her new paintings. She showed us how to build a painting directly out of a marbled pattern, deciding which shapes to turn into figures. It is a fascinating process, but very difficult, she told us, to teach on-line. She recommends finding an in-person class when that becomes available again. Her favorite teacher is Susan Cowan. Supplies can be purchased from Galen Barry on his website: www.marbleart.us.

Treat yourself to a tour of Liz's website: www.lizwalker.com. You can find lots of useful information on her site, including how to develop yourself and grow into a more successful artist by understanding "the importance of embracing one's artistic influences," both past and present. She addressed the issue of consistency in the quality of your work, and to pay attention to what other artists influence you. "Borrow but do not copy." She encourages discipline and experimentation in order to use your talents in an effective and rewarding way.




